# ORDER OF CEREMONY


### INTRODUCTORY RITE

#### PROCESSION

All stand.

#### INTRODUCTORY VERSE

All sign themselves in the form of the cross.





#### **PSALMODY**

All sit.

### Psalm 110:1-5, 7

Antiphon: Rejoice, daughter of Zion; shout for joy, daughter of Jerusalem, alleluia.



(Schola) The Lord's revelation <u>to</u> my Master:

"Sit on my right:

your foes I will put beneath your feet."

(All) The Lord will wield from Zion your scep*ter* of power:

rule in the midst of all your foes.

(Schola) A prince from the day of your birth

on the *ho*ly mountains;

from the womb before the dawn *I* begot you.

(All) The Lord has sworn an oath he will not change.

"You are a priest for ever,

a priest like Melchizedek of old."

(Schola) The Master standing <u>at</u> your right hand


