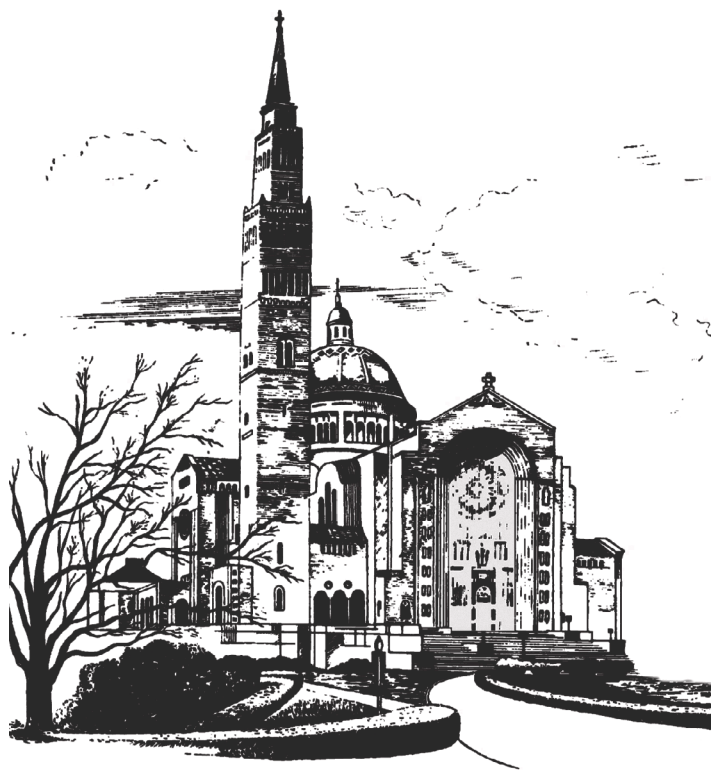

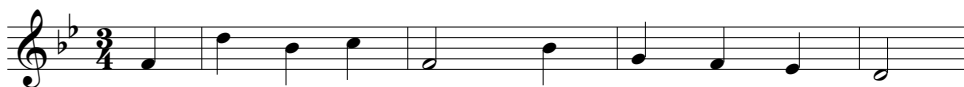

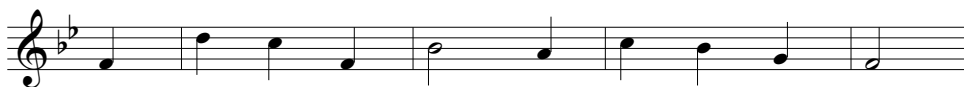
INTROIT

and dwell among Your people.

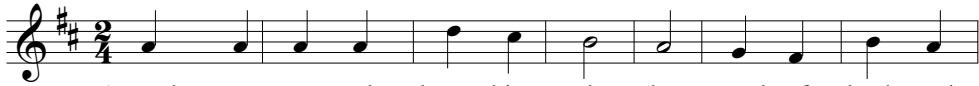
Send Your Spirit to touch the hearts






