


All stand.

 - (All) His works are jus<u>tice</u> and truth: his precepts are all <u>of</u> them sure, standing firm for ev<u>er</u> and ever: they are made in upright<u>ness</u> and truth.

as it was in the beginning, is <u>now</u>, and will be for ever. Amen.



and were raised up to the right hand of the Father,


All: in your goodness welcome your brothers and sisters

Presider: May almighty God bless you,


