

PSALM 110:1-5, 7

Lord, all-powerful King, free us for the sake of your name. Antiphon: Give us time to turn from our sins.



(Schola)	The Lord's revelation <u>to</u> my Master: "Sit on my right: your foes I will put be <u>neath</u> your feet."
(All)	The Lord will wield from Zion your scep <u>ter</u> of power: rule in the midst of <u>all</u> your foes.

(Schola)	I will thank the Lord with <u>all</u> my heart in the meeting of the just and their <u>as</u> sembly. Great are the works <u>of</u> the Lord; to be pondered by all <u>who</u> love them.
(All)	Majestic and glo <u>rious</u> his work, his justice stands firm <u>for</u> ever. He makes us remem <u>ber</u> his wonders. The Lord is compassion <u>and</u> love.
(Schola)	He gives food to <u>those</u> who fear him; keeps his covenant ever <u>in</u> mind. He has shown his might <u>to</u> his people by giving them the lands of <u>the</u> nations.
(All)	His works are jus <i>tice</i> and truth: his precepts are all of <i>them</i> sure, standing firm for ev <i>er</i> and ever: they are made in uprightness <i>and</i> truth.
(Schola)	He has sent deliverance <u>to</u> his people and established his covenant <u>fo</u> r ever. Holy his name, to <u>be</u> feared.
(All)	To fear the Lord is the first <u>stage</u> of wisdom; all who do so, prove them <u>selves</u> wise. His praise shall last <u>for</u> ever!
(All)	Glory to the Father, and <u>to</u> the Son, and to the Ho <u>ly</u> Spirit: as it was in the begin <u>ning</u> , is now, and will be for ever. <u>A</u> men.
Antiphon:	We have been redeemed by the precious blood of Christ, the lamb without blemish.

CANTICLE

Antiphon: Ours were the sufferings he bore; ours the torments he endured.



- (Schola) Christ suf<u>fered</u> for you, and left you an example to have you follow <u>in</u> his footsteps.
 (All) He <u>did</u> no wrong; no doooit was found in his mouth
 - no deceit was found <u>in</u> his mouth. When he <u>was</u> insulted, he re<u>turned</u> no insult.
- (Schola) When he was <u>made</u> to suffer, he did not coun<u>ter</u> with threats. Instead he delivered <u>him</u>self up to the One who<u>jud</u>ges justly.
 - (All) In <u>his</u> own body he brought your sins <u>to</u> the cross, so that all of us, <u>dead</u> to sin, could live in accord <u>with</u> God's will.
- *(Schola)* By his wounds <u>you</u> were healed.
 - (All) Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the <u>Ho</u>ly Spirit: as it was in the beginning, is now, and will be for e<u>ver</u>. Amen.
- Antiphon: Ours were the sufferings he bore; ours the torments he endured.


