

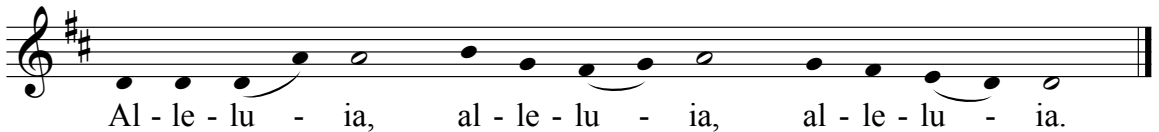

Lead us into a new millennium of life.

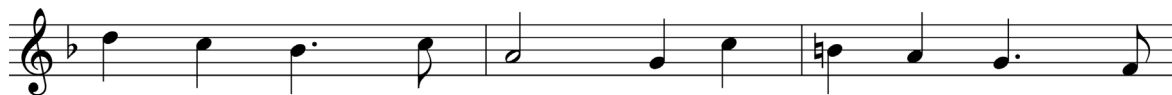
