All stand.


INTRODUCTORY VERSE

Psalm 110:1-5, 7

Antiphon: Seek the things that are above where Christ is seated at God's right hand,

alleluia.



(Schola) The Lord's revelation to <u>my</u> Master:

"Sit on my right:

your foes I will put beneath your feet."

(All) The Lord will wield from Zion your scepter <u>of</u> power: rule in the midst of *all* your foes.

(Schola) A prince from the day of your birth

on the ho<u>ly</u> mountains;

from the womb before the dawn I begot you.

(All) The Lord has sworn an oath he will <u>not</u> change.

"You are a priest for ever,

a priest like Melchize dek of old."

(Schola) The Master standing at <u>your</u> right hand

will shatter kings in the day of his great wrath.

 - (All) Riches and wealth are <u>in</u> his house;
 his justice stands <u>firm</u> for ever.
 He is a light in the darkness <u>for</u> the upright:
 he is generous, merci<u>ful</u> and just.
- (Schola) The good man takes pity and lends, he conducts his affairs with honor.

 The just man will <u>ne</u>ver waver:
 he will be remembered for ever.
 - (All) He has no fear of evil news; with a firm heart he trusts in the Lord. With a steadfast heart he will not fear; he will see the downfall of his foes.
- (Schola) Open-handed, he gives <u>to</u> the poor; his justice stands <u>firm</u> for ever. His head will be <u>raised</u> in glory.
 - (All) The wicked man sees <u>and</u> is angry, grinds his teeth and <u>fades</u> away; the desire of the wicked <u>leads</u> to doom.



Lector: You nourished our deceased brothers and sisters


with the body and blood of the risen Christ,


