


All stand.

All sit.

## PSALM 110:1-5, 7

Antiphon: God has appointed Christ to be the judge of the living and the dead.



(Schola) The Lord's revelation <u>to</u> my Master:

"Sit on my right:

your foes I will put beneath your feet."

(All) The Lord will wield from Zion

your scepter of power:

rule in the midst of all your foes.

(Schola) A prince from the day of your birth

on the *ho*ly mountains;

from the womb before the dawn  $\underline{I}$  begot you.

(All) The Lord has sworn an oath he will not change.

"You are a priest for ever,

a priest like Melchize<u>dek</u> of old."

(Schola) The Master standing <u>at</u> your right hand

will shatter kings in the day of his great wrath.

(All) He shall drink from the stream by the wayside

and therefore he shall lift <u>up</u> his head.

(All) Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the <u>Ho</u>ly Spirit:

as it was in the beginning, is now, and will be for ever. Amen.

Antiphon: God has appointed Christ to be the judge of the living and the dead.

#### PSALM 112

Antiphon: Happy the man who shows mercy for the Lord's sake; he will stand firm for ever.



- (Schola) Happy the man who <u>fears</u> the Lord. who takes delight in all his <u>com</u>mands. His sons will be power<u>ful</u> on earth; the children of the upright <u>are</u> blessed.
  - (All) Riches and wealth are <u>in</u> his house;
    his justice stands firm <u>for</u> ever.
    He is a light in the darkness <u>for</u> the upright:
    he is generous, merciful <u>and</u> just.
- (Schola) The good man takes pity and lends, he conducts his affairs with honor.

  The just man will never waver: he will be remembered for ever.
  - (All) He has no fear of <u>evil</u> news; with a firm heart he trusts in <u>the</u> Lord. With a steadfast heart he <u>will</u> not fear; he will see the downfall of <u>his</u> foes.
- (Schola) Open-handed, he gives <u>to</u> the poor; his justice stands firm <u>for</u> ever. His head will be raised <u>in</u> glory.
  - (All) The wicked man sees <u>and</u> is angry, grinds his teeth and fades <u>a</u>way; the desire of the wicked leads to doom.
  - (All) Glory to the Father, and <u>to</u> the Son, and to the Ho<u>ly</u> Spirit: as it was in the beginn<u>ing</u>, is now, and will be for ever. Amen.

Antiphon: Happy the man who shows mercy for the Lord's sake; he will stand firm for ever.

CANTICLE I Peter 2:21-24

Antiphon:

Those things, which God foretold through his prophets concerning the sufferings that Christ would endure, have been fulfilled.



(Schola) Christ suf<u>fered</u> for you, and left you an example to have you follow <u>in</u> his footsteps.

(All) He <u>did</u> no wrong; no deceit was found <u>in</u> his mouth. When he <u>was</u> insulted, he returned no insult.

(Schola) When he was <u>made</u> to suffer, he did not coun<u>ter</u> with threats. Instead he delivered <u>him</u>self up to the One who <u>judges</u> justly.

(All) In <u>his</u> own body
he brought your sins <u>to</u> the cross,
so that all of us, <u>dead</u> to sin,
could live in accord <u>with</u> God's will.

(Schola) By his wounds <u>you</u> were healed.

(All) Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the <u>Ho</u>ly Spirit: as it was in the beginning, is now, and will be for e<u>ver</u>. Amen.

Antiphon: Those things, which God foretold through his prophets concerning the sufferings that Christ would endure, have been fulfilled.

All: bring them to the vision of your glory.


