


PENITENTIAL ACT



I believe in one, holy, catholic and apostolic Church.


I confess one Baptism for the forgiveness of sins and I look forward to the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come. Amen.






Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Ghost. As it was in the beginning and is now, and ever shall be world without end. Amen.
