


All stand.




## **PSALMODY**

All sit.

## PSALM 110:1-5, 7

Antiphon: As the serpent was lifted up in the desert, so the Son of Man must be lifted up.



(Schola) The Lord's revelation <u>to</u> my Master:

"Sit on my right:

your foes I will put beneath your feet."

(All) The Lord will wield from Zion

your scep*ter* of power:

rule in the midst of all your foes.

(Schola) A prince from the day of your birth

on the *ho*ly mountains;

from the womb before the dawn  $\underline{I}$  begot you.

(All) The Lord has sworn an oath he will not change.

"You are a priest for ever,

a priest like Melchize<u>dek</u> of old."

(Schola) The Master standing <u>at</u> your right hand

will shatter kings in the day of his great wrath.

(All) He shall drink from the stream by the wayside

and therefore he shall lift <u>up</u> his head.

(All) Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the <u>Holy Spirit</u>:

as it was in the beginning, is now, and will be for ever. Amen.

Antiphon: As the serpent was lifted up in the desert, so the Son of Man must be lifted up.

## **P**SALM 114

Antiphon: The Lord of hosts protects us and sets us free; he guides and saves his people.



(Schola) When Israel came <u>forth</u> from Egypt, Jacob's sons from an ali<u>en</u> people, Judah became <u>the</u> Lord's temple, Israel became <u>his</u> kingdom.

(All) The sea fled <u>at</u> the sight: the Jordan turned back on <u>its</u> course, the mountains <u>leapt</u> like rams and the hills like year<u>ling</u> sheep.

(Schola) Why was it, sea, <u>that</u> you fled, that you turned back, Jordan, on <u>your</u> course? Mountains, that you <u>leapt</u> like rams, hills, like year<u>ling</u> sheep?

(All) Tremble, O earth, be<u>fore</u> the Lord, in the presence of the God <u>of</u> Jacob, who turns the rock in<u>to</u> a pool and flint into a spring <u>of</u> water.

(All) Glory to the Father, and <u>to</u> the Son, and to the Ho<u>ly</u> Spirit: as it was in the beginn<u>ing</u>, is now, and will be for ever. Amen.

Antiphon: The Lord of hosts protects us and sets us free; he guides and saves his people.

CANTICLE I Peter 2:21-24

Antiphon: He was pierced for our offenses and burdened with our sins.

By his wounds we are healed.



(Schola) Christ suf<u>fered</u> for you, and left you an example to have you follow <u>in</u> his footsteps.

(All) He <u>did</u> no wrong; no deceit was found <u>in</u> his mouth. When he <u>was</u> insulted, he re<u>turned</u> no insult.

(Schola) When he was <u>made</u> to suffer, he did not coun<u>ter</u> with threats. Instead he delivered <u>him</u>self up to the One who <u>judges</u> justly.

(All) In <u>his</u> own body
he brought your sins <u>to</u> the cross,
so that all of us, <u>dead</u> to sin,
could live in accord <u>with</u> God's will.

(Schola) By his wounds <u>you</u> were healed.

(All) Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the <u>Ho</u>ly Spirit: as it was in the beginning, is now, and will be for e<u>ver</u>. Amen.

Antiphon: He was pierced for our offenses and burdened with our sins. By his wounds we are healed.

READING Acts 13:26-30

My brothers, it was to us that this message of salvation was sent forth. The inhabitants of Jerusalem and their rulers failed to recognize him, and in condemning him they fulfilled the words of the prophets which we read sabbath after sabbath. Even though they found no charge against him which deserved death, they begged Pilate to have him executed. Once they had brought about all that had been written of him, they took him down from the tree and laid him in a tomb. Yet God raised him from the dead.

Presider: May almighty God bless you,


