# PSALM 110:1-5, 7

Antiphon: God raised up Christ from the dead

and gave him a place at his right hand in heaven, alleluia.



(Schola) The Lord's revelation to <u>my</u> Master:

(All) The Lord will wield from Zion

your scepter <u>of</u> power:

(Schola) The Master standing at <u>your</u> right hand

(All) He shall drink from the stream by <u>the</u> wayside

and therefore he shall lift up his head.

as it was in the beginning, is now, and will be for ever. Amen.

#### PSALM 115

Antiphon: You have been turned from faith in idols to the living God, alleluia.



- (Schola) Not to us, Lord, <u>not</u> to us, but to your name <u>give</u> the glory for the sake of your love <u>and</u> your truth, lest the heathen say: "Where <u>is</u> their God?"
  - (All) But our God is <u>in</u> the heavens; he does whate<u>ver</u> he wills.

    Their idols are sil<u>ver</u> and gold, the work of <u>hu</u>man hands.
- (Schola) They have mouths but they <u>can</u>not speak; they have eyes but they <u>can</u>not see; they have ears but they <u>can</u>not hear; They have nostrils but they <u>can</u>not smell.
  - (All) With their hands they <u>can</u>not feel;
    with their feet they <u>can</u>not walk.
    No sound comes <u>from</u> their throats.
    Their makers will come to be like them and so will all who *trust* in them.
  - (Schola) Sons of Israel, trust <u>in</u> the Lord; he is their help <u>and</u> their shield. Sons of Aaron, trust <u>in</u> the Lord; he is their help <u>and</u> their shield.
  - (All) You who fear him, trust <u>in</u> the Lord; he is their help <u>and</u> their shield. He remembers us, and <u>he</u> will bless us; he will bless the sons of Israel. He will bless the <u>sons</u> of Aaron.

(Schola) The Lord will bless <u>those</u> who fear him, the little no less <u>than</u> the great: to you may the <u>Lord</u> grant increase, to you and <u>all</u> your children.

(All) May you be blessed <u>by</u> the Lord, the maker of hea<u>ven</u> and earth.

The heavens belong <u>to</u> the Lord but the earth he has giv<u>en</u> to men.

(Schola) The dead shall not <u>praise</u> the Lord, nor those who go down in<u>to</u> the silence. But we who live <u>bless</u> the Lord now and for ever. Amen.

and to the <u>Ho</u>ly Spirit:



Lector: You nourished our deceased brothers and sisters


with the body and blood of the risen Christ,

Presider: May almighty God bless you,


