PART ONE THE SOLEMN BEGINNING OF THE VIGIL (LUCERNARIUM)

BLESSING OF FIRE AND LIGHTING OF THE CANDLE

The Celebrant and ministers gather in the Narthex of the Basilica, where a fire is kindled. The faithful are instructed in the meaning of the Vigil. The fire is blessed. The Easter Candle is lit from the new fire. The Deacon carries the Easter Candle into the darkened Basilica.

PROCESSION



Choir: Born as a Son,

led like a lamb,

sacrificed like a sheep,

buried as a man,

he rises from the dead as God, being by nature both God and man.

Assembly: Thanks be to God!

Choir: He is all things:

when he judges, he is law, when he teaches, Word, when he saves, grace, when he begets, Father, when he is begotten, Son, when he suffers, Lamb, when he is buried, man, when he rises, God.

Assembly: Thanks be to God!

Choir: Such is Jesus Christ:

to him be glory forever. Amen.

Deacon: The Light of Christ. Assembly: **Thanks be to God!**

Choir: Come, then, all you races of humankind

whom sin has saturated,

and receive the forgiveness of sin.

Assembly: Thanks be to God!

Choir: For it is I who am your forgiveness,

I, the saving Pasch,

I, the Lamb sacrificed for you,

I, your purification, I, your life, I, your resurrection, I, your light,

I, your salvation, I, your King!

Assembly: Thanks be to God!

Choir: It is I who bring you to the heights of heaven:

it is I who shall raise you up here on earth.

I will show you the eternal Father.
I will raise you with my right hand.

Deacon: The Light of Christ. Assembly: **Thanks be to God!**

Choir: Let us receive the light

and we will receive God! Let us receive the light

and become disciples of the Lord.

For he promised the Father:

"I will reveal your name to my friends,

in the midst of the congregation I will sing of you."

Assembly: Thanks be to God!

Choir: Sing, O Word, his praises

and reveal God, your Father to us!


Your words will save us and your song will teach us.

Exult, let them exult, the hosts of heaven, exult, let Angel ministers of God exult, let the trumpet of salvation sound aloud our mighty King's triumph!

Be glad, let earth be glad, as glory floods her, ablaze with light from her eternal King, let all corners of the earth be glad, knowing an end to gloom and darkness.

Rejoice, let Mother Church also rejoice, arrayed with the lightning of his glory, let this holy building shake with joy, filled with the mighty voices of the peoples.

Therefore, dearest friends, standing in the awesome glory of this holy light, invoke with me, I ask you, the mercy of God almighty, that he, who has been pleased to number me, though unworthy, among the Levites, may pour into me his light unshadowed, that I may sing this candle's perfect praises.



It is truly right and just, with ardent love of mind and heart, and with devoted service of our voice, to acclaim our God invisible, the almighty Father, and Jesus Christ, our Lord, his Son, his Only-Begotten. Who for our sake paid Adam's debt to the eternal Father, and, pouring out his own dear Blood wiped clean the record of our ancient sinfulness.

These, then, are the feasts of Passover, in which is slain the Lamb, the one true Lamb, whose Blood anoints the doorposts of believers.

This is the night, when once you led our forebears, Israel's children, from slavery in Egypt and made them pass dry-shod through the Red Sea.

This is the night that with a pillar of fire banished the darkness of sin.

This is the night that even now, throughout the world, sets Christian believers apart from worldly vices and from the gloom of sin, leading them to grace and joining them to his holy ones.

This is the night, when Christ broke the prison-bars of death, and rose victorious from the underworld.

Our birth would have been no gain, had we not been redeemed.
O wonder of your humble care for us!
O love, O charity beyond all telling, to ransom a slave you gave away your Son!

O truly necessary sin of Adam, destroyed completely by the Death of Christ!

O happy fault that earned so great, so glorious a Redeemer!

O truly blessed night, worthy alone to know the time and hour when Christ rose from the underworld!

This is the night of which it is written:
The night shall be as bright as day, dazzling is the night for me, and full of gladness.

The sanctifying power of this night dispels wickedness, washes faults away, restores innocence to the fallen, and joy to mourners, drives out hatred, fosters concord, and brings down the mighty.

On this, your night of grace, O holy Father, accept this candle, a solemn offering, the work of bees and of your servants' hands, an evening sacrifice of praise, this gift from your most holy Church.

But now we know the praises of this pillar, which glowing fire ignites for God's honor, a fire into many flames divided, yet never dimmed by sharing of its light, for it is fed by melting wax, drawn out by mother bees to build a torch so precious.

O truly blessed night, when things of heaven are wed to those of earth, and divine to the human.

Therefore, O Lord, we pray you that this candle, hallowed to the honor of your name, may persevere undimmed, to overcome the darkness of this night.

Receive it as a pleasing fragrance, and let it mingle with the lights of heaven.

May this flame be found still burning by the Morning Star: the one Morning Star who never sets, Christ your Son, who, coming back from death's domain, has shed his peaceful light on humanity, and lives and reigns for ever and ever.







The stone which the builders rejected has become the cornerstone. This is the work of the Lord, a marvel in our eyes. R.



GUIDELINES FOR THE RECEPTION OF COMMUNION

For Catholics

As Catholics, we fully participate in the celebration of the Eucharist when we receive Holy Communion. We are encouraged to receive Communion devoutly and frequently. In order to be properly disposed to receive Communion, participants should not be conscious of grave sin and normally should have fasted for one hour. A person who is conscious of grave sin is not to receive the Body and Blood of the Lord without prior sacramental confession except for a grave reason where there is no opportunity for confession. In this case, the person is to be mindful of the obligation to make an act of perfect contrition, including the intention of confessing as soon as possible (canon 916). A frequent reception of the Sacrament of Penance is encouraged for all.

For Our Fellow Christians

We welcome our fellow Christians to this celebration of the Eucharist as our brothers and sisters. We pray that our common baptism and the action of the Holy Spirit in this Eucharist will draw us closer to one another and begin to dispel the sad divisions which separate us. We pray that these will lessen and finally disappear, in keeping with Christ's prayer for us "that they may all be one" (John 17:21).

Because Catholics believe that the celebration of the Eucharist is a sign of the reality of the oneness of faith, life, and worship, members of those churches with whom we are not yet fully united are ordinarily not admitted to Holy Communion. Eucharistic sharing in exceptional circumstances by other Christians requires permission according to the directives of the diocesan bishop and the provisions of canon law (canon 844 § 4). Members of the Orthodox Churches, the Assyrian Church of the East, and the Polish National Catholic Church are urged to respect the discipline of their own Churches. According to Roman Catholic discipline, the Code of Canon Law does not object to the reception of communion by Christians of these Churches (canon 844 § 3).

For Non-Christians

We also welcome to this celebration those who do not share our faith in Jesus Christ. While we cannot admit them to Holy Communion, we ask them to offer their prayers for the peace and the unity of the human family.

For Those Not Receiving Holy Communion

All who are not receiving Holy Communion are encouraged to express in their hearts a prayerful desire for unity with the Lord Jesus and with one another.

COMMUNION ANTIPHON

Christ our Passover has been sacrificed; therefore let us keep the feast with the unleavened bread of purity and truth, alleluia.

CELEBRATING 100 YEARS OF WORSHIP

Today, Easter Sunday 2024, marks the centennial anniversary of the celebration of the first Public Mass held inside the National Shrine. The celebration of the inauguration of the liturgical life of this grand and noble votive church in honor of Mary, the Immaculate Conception, begins during the noon Solemn Eucharist with Wilton Cardinal Gregory, Archbishop of Washington and chairman of the National Shrine Board of Trustees, as the principal celebrant and homilist.

The sacred vessels used at this Mass include the same chalice used one hundred years ago. Other special liturgical items and gifts employed today and throughout the coming year include the crosier of Bishop Thomas J. Shahan and the Marian Year cruets (1954-55) of Pope Pius XII.

A holy card featuring Our Lady of Washington will be given to all who attend any of the Masses at the National Shrine on Easter Sunday. After today, the holy cards will be available in the gift and book shops of the National Shrine.

May Mary's House continue to be a place of prayer and pilgrimage that leads us, through Mary, ever closer to her Son, Jesus Christ, our Risen Lord.
