



# PSALM 110:1-5, 7

Antiphon: Christ was scourged and treated with contempt, but God's right hand has raised him up.



*(Schola)* The Lord's revelation <u>to</u> my Master: "Sit on my right: your foes I will put be<u>neath</u> your feet."

(All) The Lord will wield from Zion your scep<u>ter</u> of power:rule in the midst of <u>all</u> your foes.

*(Schola)* A prince from the day of your birth on the <u>ho</u>ly mountains; from the womb before the dawn <u>I</u> begot you. (All) The Lord has sworn an oath he <u>will</u> not change.
"You are a priest for ever, a priest like Melchize<u>dek</u> of old."

*(Schola)* The Master standing <u>*at*</u> your right hand will shatter kings in the day of <u>*his*</u> great wrath.

- (All) He shall drink from the stream <u>by</u> the way side
   and therefore he shall lift <u>up</u> his head.

# PSALM 115

Antiphon: The blood of Christ washes away our sins and makes us worthy to serve the living God.



*(Schola)* Not to us, Lord, *not* to us, but to your name give *the* glory for the sake of your love *and* your truth, lest the heathen say: "Where is *their* God?"

(All) But our God is <u>in</u> the heavens; he does whatever <u>he</u> wills. Their idols are sil<u>ver</u> and gold, the work of hu<u>man</u> hands.

*(Schola)* They have mouths but they <u>can</u>not speak; they have eyes but they can<u>not</u> see; they have ears but they <u>can</u>not hear; they have nostrils but they can<u>not</u> smell. (All) With their hands they <u>can</u>not feel; with their feet they can<u>not</u> walk.
No sound comes <u>from</u> their throats.
Their makers will come to be like them and so will all who trust <u>in</u> them.

*(Schola)* Sons of Israel, trust <u>in</u> the Lord; he is their help and <u>their</u> shield. Sons of Aaron, trust <u>in</u> the Lord; he is their help and <u>their</u> shield.

(All) You who fear him, trust <u>in</u> the Lord;
he is their help and <u>their</u> shield.
He remembers us, and <u>he</u> will bless us;
he will bless the sons of Israel.
He will bless the sons <u>of</u> Aaron

*(Schola)* The Lord will bless <u>those</u> who fear him, the little no less than <u>the</u> great: to you may the <u>Lord</u> grant increase, to you and all <u>your</u> children. (All) May you be blessed <u>by</u> the Lord, the maker of heaven <u>and</u> earth.
The heavens belong <u>to</u> the Lord but the earth he has given <u>to</u> men.

*(Schola)* The dead shall not <u>praise</u> the Lord, nor those who go down in<u>to</u> silence. But we who live <u>bless</u> the Lord now and for ever. <u>A</u>men.

- (All) Glory to the Father, and <u>to</u> the Son, and to the Ho<u>ly</u> Spirit: as it was in the beginn<u>ing</u>, is now, and will be for ever. <u>A</u>men.

# CANTICLE

### I Peter 2:21-24

Antiphon: Christ bore our sins in his own body on the cross so that we might die to sin and be alive to all that is good.



*(Schola)* Christ suf*fered* for you, and left you an example to have you follow *in* his footsteps.

(All) He <u>did</u> no wrong;
no deceit was found <u>in</u> his mouth.
When he <u>was</u> insulted,
he re<u>turned</u> no insult.

*(Schola)* When he was <u>made</u> to suffer, he did not coun<u>ter</u> with threats. Instead he delivered <u>him</u>self up to the One who <u>jud</u>ges justly. (All) In <u>his</u> own body
he brought your sins <u>to</u> the cross,
so that all of us, <u>dead</u> to sin,
could live in accord <u>with</u> God's will.

(Schola) By his wounds <u>you</u> were healed.

- (All) Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the <u>Ho</u>ly Spirit: as it was in the beginning, is now, and will be for e<u>ver</u>. Amen.
- Antiphon: Christ bore our sins in his own body on the cross so that we might die to sin and be alive to all that is good.

# READING

My brothers, it was to us that this message of salvation was sent forth. The inhabitants of Jerusalem and their rulers failed to recognize him, and in condemning him they fulfilled the words of the prophets which we read sabbath after sabbath. Even though they found no charge against him which deserved death, they begged Pilate to have him executed. Once they had brought about all that had been written of him, they took him down from the tree and laid him in a tomb. Yet God raised him from the dead.

*(Schola)* Sicut locutus est ad patres <u>nos</u>tros, Abraham, et semini e<u>ius</u> in sæcula.


