and will be for ever. Amen.

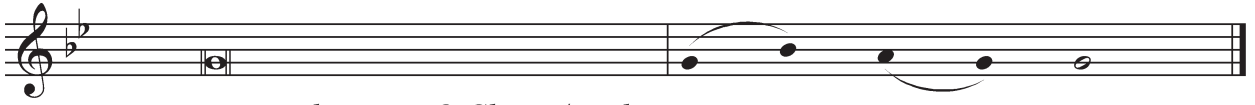

even to accepting death, death on a cross,

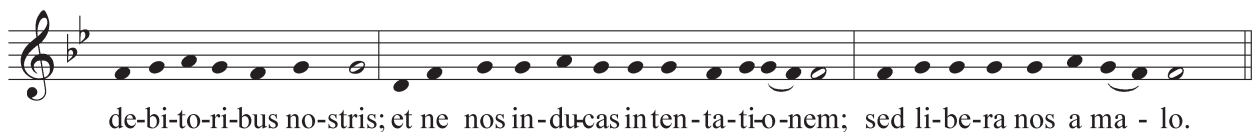
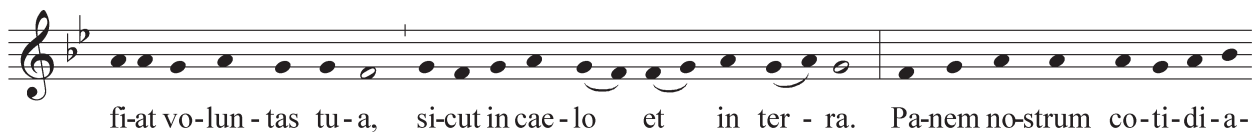
**All: give all who serve you the gifts


