PSALMODY

Psalm 110:1-5, 7

Antiphon: He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father, alleluia.



(Schola) The Lord's revelation to <u>my</u> Master:

"Sit on my right:

your foes I will put be<u>neath</u> your feet."

(All) The Lord will wield from Zion your scepter <u>of</u> power: rule in the midst of <u>all</u> your foes.

(Schola) A prince from the day of your birth

on the holy mountains;

from the womb before the dawn <u>I</u> begot you.

(All) The Lord has sworn an oath he will <u>not</u> change.

"You are a priest for ever,

a priest like Melchizedek of old."

(Schola) The Master standing at <u>your</u> right hand

will shatter kings in the day of his great wrath.

(All) He shall drink from the stream by <u>the</u> wayside

and therefore he shall lift up his head.

(All) Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Ho<u>ly</u> Spirit:

as it was in the beginning, is now, and will be for ever. Amen.

PSALM 47

Antiphon: God ascends to shouts of joy, the Lord to the blast of trumpets, alleluia.



- (Schola) All peoples, <u>clap</u> your hands, cry to God with <u>shouts</u> of joy! For the Lord, the Most High, <u>we</u> must fear, great king over <u>all</u> the earth.
 - (All) He subdues <u>peoples</u> under us and nations un<u>der</u> our feet.

 Our inheritance, our glory, <u>is</u> from him, given to Jacob <u>out</u> of love.
- (Schola) God goes up with <u>shouts</u> of joy; the Lord goes up with <u>trum</u>pet blast. Sing praise for <u>God</u>, sing praise, sing praise to our <u>king</u>, sing praise.
 - (All) God is king of <u>all</u> the earth, sing praise with <u>all</u> your skill. God is king o<u>ver</u> the nations; God reigns on his <u>ho</u>ly throne.
- (Schola) The princes of the people <u>are</u> assembled with the people of Ab<u>ra</u>ham's God.

 The rulers of the earth be<u>long</u> to God, to God who reigns <u>o</u>ver all.
 - (All) Glory to the Father, and <u>to</u> the Son, and to the <u>Ho</u>ly Spirit: as it was in the begin<u>ning</u>, is now, and will be for e<u>yer</u>. Amen.



Lector: True God, we await your coming as our judge,


All: may we see the vision of your glory and your mercy


